Learning To Print...



If you child is interested in learning to print their name, please teach them to capitalize the first letter and use lower case for the remaining letters. This is the printing format that kindergarten teachers prefer. Additionally, the D'Nealian style of printing is recommended by kindergarten teachers in neighboring districts. This slanted style of printing will transfer more easily to cursive writing. A D'Nealian guide was included in your Parent Handbook. You can get another copy from your teacher if you desire.
